

## RULES AND REGULATIONS NO.5

### RULES AND REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING A RATE FOR THE FURNISHING OF WATER SERVICE BY THE EL PASO WATER UTILITIES

BY THE AUTHORITY GRANTED TO THE PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD BY VIRTUE OF ARTICLES 1111- 1118, REVISED CIVIL STATUTES OF TEXAS, AND ORDINANCE 752, PASSED AND APPROVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO, TEXAS ON MAY 22, 1952 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD OF THE CITY OF EL PASO, THAT THE FOLLOWING WATER RATES SUPERSEDE ALL RATES HERETOFORE FIXED AND ALL ORDINANCES HERETO PASSED WITH REFERENCE TO THE FIXING OF RATES FOR THE FURNISHING OF WATER SERVICE: (KNOWN AS RULES AND REGULATIONS NO.5).

#### SECTION I

A monthly charge consisting of a minimum charge and a commodity charge for water used shall be collected from users of every water service connected to the water system of the El Paso Water Utilities of the City of El Paso, Texas ("Utility"). The minimum charge will include a volume allowance of five hundred cubic feet (5 CCF) for residential customers only. The following charges shall apply:

#### A. MONTHLY MINIMUM CHARGES FOR WATER SERVICE BASED ON THE SIZE OF THE METER

#### B. Water used in excess of the volume allowance included in the minimum charge shall be billed at the following rates:

	1 CCF to 150% of AWC* (Nonresidential)	\$3.92

#### C. AVERAGE WINTER CONSUMPTION (AWC)\*

Average Winter Consumption ("AWC") means the average amount of water used during the most recent December, January, and February billing periods. If the customer's calculated AWC is lower than the class average, then the customer will be assigned the class average AWC by meter size for the respective customer classification. Any unestablished (no history) customer at the time of service will default to the class average AWC by meter size for that customer classification until such time that an AWC can be established.

D. WATER SUPPLY REPLACEMENT CHARGE

The following monthly Replacement Charge shall be collected from users of every service connected to the water system, including Local Government Turf Accounts and Very Large Water Users:

\* If the monthly water consumption is 4 CCF or less, the monthly charge for the Water Supply Replacement Charge will not be charged.

- E. Charges for services less than the normal reading cycle shall be calculated in the same manner as a full reading cycle.

F. VERY LARGE WATER USERS

Section 15.13.050 of the City of El Paso Municipal Code, also known as The Water Conservation Ordinance, defines a "Very Large Water User" as any person who uses an average of 100,000 gallons or more per day. Monthly metered water consumption for any Very Large Water User shall be charged in accordance with the following table:

Block 1	0 CCF to 5,000 CCF	\$4.77
Block 2	5,001 CCF to 15,000 CCF	\$6.49
Block 3	Over 15,000 CCF	\$9.26

The Monthly Minimum Charge based on meter size, as specified in Section I, A of these Rules and Regulations, shall also apply to all Very Large Water Users. There will be no minimum volume allowance included in the Monthly Minimum Charge; all metered use will be charged at the rates listed above.

For existing accounts served by the Utility, daily water use shall be determined each year based on metered water consumption for the twelve-month period ending December 31. Annual water use (in gallons) will be divided by 365 to determine daily water use. Any account determined to have used an average of 100,000 or more gallons per day shall be classified as a Very Large Water User, and the rates contained in this subsection shall apply for the twelve-month period beginning March 1 and ending at the end of February of the following fiscal year. This classification shall apply for the full twelve-month period regardless of actual water use. The procedure for determining a Very Large Water User shall be repeated each year based on annual metered water

use per account for the twelve months ending December 31.

New accounts with an anticipated water use in excess of 100,000 gallons per day will be charged the rates for Very Large Water Users until sufficient data is available for a consecutive twelve-month period.

This data shall then be used to calculate average daily water consumption and determine whether an account meets the definition of a Very Large Water User.

\*This rate does not apply to Local Government Landscape and Irrigation Accounts.

G. LOCAL GOVERNMENT LANDSCAPE AND IRRIGATION RATE

A uniform rate of \$4.77 per hundred cubic feet (CCF) is hereby established for the Local Government Landscape and Irrigation Accounts. Local Government Landscape and Irrigation Accounts shall be established for customers who will use water for irrigation and landscaping only. The Utility has the authority to consider an account as a Local Government Landscape and Irrigation Account.

The following entities will be considered to be a Local Government: any county, municipality, village, town, a common or independent school district, hospital district, or political subdivision of the State of Texas; however, any department, board, or agency of the State of Texas shall be excluded from this definition.

If reclaimed water is available but a Local Government Landscape and Irrigation Account customer does not connect to the reclaimed water system, that customer must pay the rate set forth in this subsection G. Reclaimed water is considered available if the property abuts on an easement or street with a reclaimed water line capable of providing service.

H. BRACKISH AND RECLAIMED WATER RATE

Brackish Water means water containing 1000 mg/L or more of Total Dissolved Solids (TDS) and/or 300 mg/L or more of chlorides.

Except as specified in specific contractual arrangements, the following charges will apply to all reclaimed water delivered to customers:

The Utility will supply Brackish Water at a rate of \$3.92 per CCF.

I. NON-GOVERNMENT LANDSCAPE AND IRRIGATION RATE

A uniform rate of \$9.26 per hundred cubic feet (CCF) is hereby established for all Non-Government Landscape and Irrigation Accounts. Non-Government Landscape and Irrigation Accounts shall be established for customers who will use water for landscaping and turf irrigation only. The Utility has the authority to consider an account as a Non-Government Landscape and Irrigation Account. The Non-Government Landscape and Irrigation rate does not include non-irrigation usage. Non-irrigation usage includes but is not limited to the use of water for swimming pools, fountains, and for human and animal consumption.

J. CONSTRUCTION METER RATES

For all construction meter accounts, a uniform rate equal to the rate established in Section I,B, for Block 2 category is hereby established. Reclaimed water used for construction purposes will be billed at the rates established in Rules and Regulations No. 6, Section X.

K. WATER CONNECTION FEES RELATED TO ANNEXATION FEES Implemented in 1999 (Ordinances 014262, 014200) and 2005

For property subject to annexation fees pursuant to a contract, a water connection fee shall be paid at the time of application for meter installation, including fire line and irrigation/yard services, for each water meter that is connected to the Utility's water system. All water connection fees shall increase 3% annually in accordance with the applicable City of El Paso Ordinance. The current and calculated fees are listed in the tables below.

L. CITY OF EL PASO FRANCHISE FEE

Effective March 1, 2020, City Council amended Title 15 (Public Service) Chapter 15.12 (Water and Sewer System) of the El Paso City code by adding Section 15.12.015 (Utility Franchise Fee) for the grant of a franchise to the water and sewer utility managed by the Public Service Board for the operation and maintenance of the water and sewer utility system and the assessment of a franchise fee up to \$6,550,000. The City of El Paso' franchise fee is applied to all residential, non-residential, and standby fire protection accounts based on meter size as follows:

- M. In the interest of transparency, the President/CEO or designee may determine that customer bills will reflect rate components. Additionally, the President/CEO is expressly authorized to adjust the franchise fee amounts to comply with the franchise fee as the El Paso City Council may amend it from time to time.

SECTION II - Standby Fire Protection Charge

A monthly Standby Fire Protection Charge shall be collected from every user of a connection to the water system for providing Standby Fire Protection services based on the size of the service as follows:

All standby fire line services require a bypass detector meter to be installed. Such bypass detector meters shall be accessible to the Utility for meter reading on a monthly basis. Non-fire-related consumption through a standby fire line service is not permissible and shall be charged the current Block 3 water rate per CCF per Section I.(B) of Rules and Regulations No. 5. A fire line testing allowance of 1 CCF or less is considered in the billing assessment. All consumption greater than 1 CCF will be billed at current Block 3 rates.

If the standby fire service is determined to have a leak, which the customer could not have reasonably detected, then the Utility shall allow relief to the customer under Section V of Rules and Regulations No. 5, guidelines below.

If consumption of water through the standby fire line service is due to an actual fire on the premises, only the fixed meter charge will be assessed to the customer, pending written confirmation from the City of El Paso Fire Department.

### SECTION III – Outside City of El Paso Service Charges

All of the aforementioned charges apply to water service to property within the City of El Paso. Where the water connection provides service to property outside the City limits of El Paso, the charge for such service shall be 1.15 times the rates for similar service to customers, whose property is inside the city limits, including the monthly Water Supply Replacement Charge. This section also applies to Esperanza Water customers effective March 1, 2025.

### SECTION IV - Service and Tampering Fees

A \$20.00 trip fee is charged to customers that are flagged for disconnection for non-payment.

A \$25.00 fee is charged to customers to restore services that have been disconnected for non-payment. This fee will be applied to the next billing cycle.

A tampering fee will be charged to any customer found with water service that has been restored by an unauthorized party, where the meter is removed and/or relocated by a person other than Utility personnel, or usage of bypass line and straight connection to service line. Only Utility representatives are authorized to restore water services. This fee may be charged to the current account holder or tampering party where the tampering occurs. All fees and current past due amounts must be paid prior to restoration of services. Tampering fees are as following:

1. Permanent Accounts - \$100.00 for first incident; \$500.00 per subsequent incidents.
2. Construction Account - \$1,000.00 for first incident; \$1,500.00 for second incident; \$2,000.00 per subsequent incidents.

Fire Hydrant Tampering: A water loss fee of \$1,000 will be charged to the Customer or tampering party where unmetered water is taken for a fire hydrant. A \$1,000 fee will be charged to the Customer or tampering party for damages to fire hydrants plus costs related to repair and replacement of parts. A \$2,000 fee will be charged for each fire hydrant tampering occurrence thereafter.

Fee for Meter and/or Box Damaged during Construction – Current account holder will be held liable for the cost of replacing damaged meters and/or meter boxes on construction sites. The service charge for replacing the meter and/or will be the replacement cost plus \$300.00 for field service installation, and administrative services associated with this service.

Insufficient Funds Fee- A \$25.00 fee applies to all returned payments for insufficient funds or other returns by a financial institution. Customers with a history of returned payments may be placed on a “cash only” status at the sole discretion of the Utility based on the account history and credit rating.

### SECTION V– Leak Adjustment Policy

On January 11, 2023, the Public Service Board (PSB) approved the Servline Leak Protection Program (Program), which became effective March 1, 2023, with revisions to be effective on May 1, 2025. This Program will help customers by covering up to \$2,500 of the cost related to excess water consumption reflected in a high-water bill due to a water leak.

All residential and single occupancy non-residential customers with meters sizes of 2” or less, will be enrolled in the leak protection Program and charged a monthly fee of \$1.59 for residential and \$2.31 for non-residential. This Program covers the two (2) highest consumption bills in a three-month consecutive span up to \$2,500 upon the customer providing proof of the leak repair.

Customers who participate in the Program, whose excess water consumption due to a leak exceeds \$2,500 on their water bill, may request assistance from the Utility, and may receive assistance of 50% of the remaining bill balance over the \$2,500 covered by the Program.

Customers will be able to opt out of the program at any time. If a customer opts out:

- Customer has to contact HomeServe and request removal from the Program. The Utility at its sole discretion, will consider a leak adjustment credit for the two (2) highest consumption bills in a three-month consecutive span. Nothing in this Section relieves the customer of the obligation to repair such a leak as required by the Water Conservation Ordinance, Chapter 15.13 of the City of El Paso Municipal Code.
- If the customer fixes the leak and it is confirmed by lower consumption in the month following the alleged leak's repair, the Utility may credit the customer 50% of the excess water consumption on a future bill.

All EPWater customers with meters larger than 2" may be eligible for a utility leak adjustment for a credit of 50% of the water excess consumption.

The amount of water lost will be calculated by using the two highest consecutive months affected by the leak less the average water charges billed over the previous twelve-month period for a credit of the excess water consumption. If the customer has no prior usage history, the Utility may, at its sole discretion, use the previous customer's history.

If any leak adjustment is made, no further adjustments will be made on the same account for 24 months from the date of the adjustment. The Utility may, on an individual basis, allow a customer to make deferred payments for such leaks.

#### SECTION VI—Esperanza Water Rates and Fees

Water rates for Esperanza customers are the same as those for outside city of El Paso customers. See Section III for additional information.

#### SECTION VII

Rule and Regulations No.5 shall be and become effective from and after their adoption by the Public Service Board and shall remain in effect until amended or changed by the Public Service Board. Changes to any fees or rates resulting from approval of the budget are effective on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of March and shall remain in effect until amended or changed by the Public Service Board.

#### SECTION VIII - SEVERABILITY

These Rules and Regulations are part of the other Rules and Regulations of the Public Service Board and persons accepting service agree to comply with the appropriate provisions and conditions of all of the Rules and Regulations. If any provision, paragraph, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of these Rules and Regulations No. 5 or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances is for any reason invalidated by any court of competent jurisdiction, such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remaining parts of these Rules and Regulations No. 5. The remaining provisions, paragraphs, words or sections shall not be affected and shall continue in full force and effect.

#### SECTION IX - SAVINGS

These Rules and Regulations are a part of the other Rules and Regulations of the Public Service Board and, save and except as amended hereby, the remaining provisions of the Public Service Board's Rules and Regulations shall remain in full force and effect.
